


Lesson 8

To Receive Jesus Worthily



A few days after the resurrection of Jesus, two of the disciples were going to the village of Emmaus. While they were talking about and discussing the events that occurred in Jerusalem during those days, Jesus came close to them and journeyed with them. But they did not recognise Jesus. They were gloomy.



Jesus asked them what they were talking about. They answered that they were talking about the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. Then Jesus interpreted to them quoting the scriptures that Christ had to suffer all these and thus enter into His glory
(Like 24:13-35)






When they reached Emmaus, the disciples compelled Him to stay with them and He did so. While they were at supper, Jesus took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them. Then, their eyes were opened. They recognised Him. He deepened their faith by interpreting the Holy Scriptures before He blessed, broke and gave the bread.



Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist on the pascal Feast Day. In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus give His own body and blood as the food for our souls. We must have due devotion to receive the body and blood of Jesus that gives us forgiveness of sin and divine life.



We need holiness to receive the body and blood of Jesus. Hence we have to examine ourselves whether we are in a state of grace. We should not receive Holy Communion with mortal sin. We have to get forgiveness of sin through the sacrament of reconciliation and receive Jesus with a pure heart.

“Whoever, therefore, eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for body and blood the Lord. Examine yourselves, and only then eat of the bread and drink of the cup”


(1 Cor. 11:27-28).

When we receive this sacrament of love, we must remember we have to live in love and communion with God our fellow-beings. The peace wishing in the Holy Mass reminds us of this.





In the Holy Mass, the service of reconciliation just before receiving Holy Communion helps us examine our conscience. In that service, we get reconciled with God and our brethren and receive forgiveness of sin. The fasting before receiving Holy Communion will greatly strengthen our preparation. We need preparation and devotion to receive Holy Communion. Let us lovingly receive Jesus who comes to us.



Preparations necessary for receiving Holy Communion.

1. Be in the state of grace.
2. Fast at least one hour before receiving the Holy communion
3. Have proper preparation and devotion





Whoever receives the body and blood of Jesus becomes participants of His divine. The Holy Eucharist is a banquet of mutual love and service. Those who eat of the same bread should live in communion. We must show mutual love and friendship. Thus, all of us have to become one in Jesus. Let us eat and satisfy ourselves from the altar of the Lord. May the Holy Mass strengthen us to be faithful children of the church.





Let us pray
