



THE FEASTS OF ISRAEL





The people of Israel started a happy life in the Land of Canaan. Canaan, a land full of God's blessings.

All hardships of People of Israel came to an end, at the end of the miraculous liberation and long journey from the slavery in Egypt.

People of Israel celebrated various feasts, to commemorate God's greatness in their life and to ask for God's forgiveness for their sins.


The festivals reminded the Israelites the important events in the history of salvation.

Celebrations: Loud shout of Joy Trumpet calls Offering of sacrifices

THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD

Celebrated to thank God. Celebrations started at the beginning of Harvest and lasted for 7 days.

They cooked and eat Unleavened Bread, made of flour from fresh produce. This feast used to start on the first day after the feast Of Passover. As time passed, they started to celebrate These two feasts together (Lev.23 : 5-8).



THE FEAST OF PASSOVER



A festival to commemorate the miraculous liberation of Israelites from the slavery of Egypt.

The people of Israel must celebrate the Passover on a fixed schedule. On the fourteenth day of the month, they must celebrate the Passover according to the rules and regulations.






Moses passed on the words spoken by God to the people of Israel. Thus they celebrated the Passover in the desert.



Israelites used to have their Passover meal every year in the evening of the fourteenth day of the first month, which is month of Nissan.


At sunset of the 14th day the lamb was sacrificed.

The lamb for the meal was chosen 4 days earlier.




The blood of the lamb was sprinkled on door posts.

The cooked meal was eaten with bitter herbs and Unleavened bread. The meal was eaten in a hurry.











Reminds the stay of Israelites in tents, when they were brought out of Egypt.



This feast remind your descendants that when I brought the Israelites out of Egypt, they lived in tents (Lev 23: 33-43).



The Festival of Booth - a Harvest festival

They celebrated it by weaving leaves of date palms and trees.


Foreigners, orphans and widows used to participate in the festival along with family members.

They used to confess their Faith in God who protects them.

During Harvest they made tents or booths

and staying in them they celebrated the festival of Booths.

THE FEAST OF PENTECOST



Celebrated on the 50th day of the season of harvest. First fruits of harvest were offered to Lord on this occasion.

The feast also knows as

- > Festival of weeks
 - > Harvest festival
- > Festival of first fruits.

THE DAY OF ATONEMENT



The festival of the Day of Atonement, also is called "Yom Kippur" which is a Hebrew word.

The Hebrew word "Yom Kippur", reminds one, of the holiness of the Lord as well as the sinfulness of Israel.

The festival of the Day of Atonement, an opportunity to reconcile with others and seek God's forgiveness.


CHRISTMAS

Birth of Jesus Christ



Christmas is the feast that reminds people of the birth of Jesus. This commemorates the incarnation of Jesus the son of God who came on earth to bring salvation to manking. Christmas is celebrated, the world over, on 25 December.

EPIPHANY





This commemorates the purification of Jesus. The Church celebrates this feast on 6 January.

PASCHAL FEAST



This is a very important feast in the Church. The last Supper, which Jesus had eaten with his disciples in the hall of Zion, was the Paschal meal or Passover Weal. The memory of Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist at the meal is what we celebrate today as the Paschal feast.

EASTER

Easter or the feast of Resurrection is the commemoration of the resurrection of Jesus three days after he was buried following his passion (torture) and crucifixion. This is referred to as the feast. Fifty days of fasting is observed in preparation for Easter is very important as the feast signifies the consummation of God's plan of salvation.







ASCENSION



Jesus ascended into Heaven 40 days after His resurrection.

Jesus was lifted up into Heaven, while the disciples were watching.

After accomplishing the task, Salvation of humanity.

Jesus went back to Heaven.

Jesus is seated at the right side of His Father.

Feast of ascension reminds us of Jesus who is preparing a place for us in Heaven.

PENTECOST





50 days after the resurrection of Jesus (or 10 days after the ascension of Jesus into Heaven)
Holy Spirit came down, upon the disciples, in the form of tongues of fire.

Pentecost means 50th day.

Church has started functioning as an institution on that day.

Church commemorates its institution on that day.

Feast of Pentecost reminds us of the Holy Spirit being sent to live in and lead the Church.

This feast helps Church and her children to be filled with the divine grace of the Holy Spirit.



Church celebrates many festivals connected with Jesus, Mother Mary and Saints.

These feasts are Holy days.

We offer thanks to God by celebrating them with pomp. Celebration of the feasts by reflecting on the meaning and message of each feast help in our Spiritual Growth.
